Dear Neighbor,

As you know, KCBX has made significant changes to our terminal operations in Chicago over the past two years, including the removal of all outdoor product piles of coal and petroleum coke. Our terminal located near 107th and Burley now operates exclusively as a direct transfer facility where product moves directly between various modes of transportation.

Last year we also closed our original terminal located on 100th Street, which we had operated for more than 25 years. That property has recently been sold to Century Docks, LLC, which is affiliated with existing local Chicagoland-based companies. This sale will allow the site to continue being a source for jobs and tax revenue contributing to the local economy.

This spring you may notice the progress of a landscaping project we started near 111th and Burley just east of the railroad tracks adjacent to homes in the neighborhood. We have contracted with a local landscaping company to provide a spring clean-up in the newly planted area.

We also continue to operate our around-the-clock air monitoring system and report the results on our web site at www.kcbxchicago.com. There you can also see a new video of our direct transfer operation.
